John Hyde, Of Yale, Takes Two Thirds In State Track

Four Blue Water District high school athletes took second or third places in State track meets Saturday.

John Hyde, of Yale, took third place in the 100 and 220-yard dashes in the B division.

Aaron Gettel, of Pigeon, placed second in the 440-yard dash and Bates, of Millington, took a third in the same event. All in Class C.

Bud Ebling, of Almont, placed third in the Class C 440-yard dash.

Rangy Ray Eggleston, East Jackson's one-man show, and Coach Herb Korf's point-pinching Saginaw team are the big names in Michigan High School track circles today.

Saginaw brought the school its eighth Class A Lower Peninsula title in the last 17 meets by winning only one first place and methodically picking up six other lesser places. It was a strange, but happy finish for a team that had been favored to win three events at least.

And Eggleston, a blond speedster, scored all his team's points in the top individual show in 20 years of Michigan prep track. It gave East Jackson a tie with Ann Arbor University high for the C crown in the other half of the competition at Ann Arbor.

Saginaw scored only 21 points to second place Pontiac's 19½ points. Previously Saginaw won in 1935, 1938 and 1945 through 1949.

Bob Pildner won the 880-yard run in 2:04.2 for Saginaw's only first place. Art Liles finished second in the 120-yard high hurdles. The team also recorded one third, a fourth, a fifth and two sixths. A dropped baton and a spill kept Saginaw's two strong relay teams from gaining any points.

Eggleston piled up 24 points by winning the 120-yard high hurdles in 15.8, 180-yard low hurdles in 21.2, broad jump in 21 feet 7½ inches and high jump in 5 feet 10 inches. It was the greatest individual performance since Clare McDurmon won four events in 1932 to pace his team to the C title.

Bob Zimmerman paced Roseville to its B victory by winning the broad jump in 20 feet 4¾ inches and the 220-yard dash in 23.9 and anchoring the 880-relay team, which won in 1:37.4. Teammate Jack Kirchoff won the 180-yard low hurdles in :22.1.

Defending Champion Cadillac finished second with 16 points to Roseville's 33.

Brethren's victory was the most overwhelming, the little Manistee County school scoring 46 2/5 points to Edwardsburg's 20 2/5.
