

Shamrocks End League Competition as Champs

Take Track Title Easily

CC Wins Seven Events; St. Joe 2nd

A champion right to the finish.

That's the role Catholic Central High School played Wednesday as it bade farewell to the Catholic League by successfully defending its track and field title at University of Detroit Stadium.

Catholic Central withdrew under pressure three months ago culminating years of bickering. Rival schools claimed the Shamrocks had no place in league athletics due to their enrollment which more than doubled that of any other rival.

CENTRAL WON seven of the 12 firsts in the two-day meet and set two records in scoring 54½ points. Tony Hirsch added the high jump title to his high hurdle victory scored Tuesday.

Other CC winners were Ed Haddad in the shot, Ted Kihar in the 440, Frank Theisen in the 880 and victories in both relays.

The Shamrocks wrapped up the title in Wednesday's first event placing 1-2-4 in the shot put. Bob Molla grabbed runnerup honors to Haddad and Bob Oriowski placed fourth.

PICKING UP 25 points in the dashes, low hurdles and relay, St. Joseph overhauled DeLaSalle and Servite for second place honors. St. Joe accumulated 40 points to 31½ for both LaSalle and Servite.

Marvin Boroski, of LaSalle, accounted for the only record set Wednesday. He won the 120-yard high hurdles in :21.8. He was clocked in :21.4, however, in his preliminary heat which bettered the previous record of :21.7 set by Sammy Simpson, of Catholic Central, last year.
