

### Falcons Bow To Stags in Indoor Meet

Relay Event Decides Close Prep Match

Fretting Dick Frankowski, whose ulcer troubles forced him to forego football at Mackenzie High, found his new job as track and field coach, no easier on the nerves.

The veteran coach saw his stags squeeze to a 46%-43% edge over Northeastern as the City League indoor season opened.

A 1:40.3 victory in the sprint relay, earned by Norm Zackewicz, Naim Miller, Ray Shaheen and Bryant McKuen, gave the Stags their winning edge.

Covert Leffler, with an .045 victory in the lows, a second behind Northeastern's Willie Atkins (.044) in the high hurdles, and a tie for second in the high jump, was Mackenzie's top scorer. He had 9½ points. Atkins won the pole vault in addition to his hurdle victory.

MILLER, top power of the East Side, smashed Northern's defending but depleted champions, 65 to 26, winning nine of 11 events. James McLeod collected 11¼ points for the Trojans, although he failed to take a first place.

The Trojans got the day's best half mile from James Watkins, who won in 2:11 as Miller slammed the event.

Eastern took nine first as it whipped Denby, 53 to 38. Billy Smith took the hurdles; Jack Allen the mile in 4:51; Vern LaFalve the 440 in :58.2, Charles Martin the 890 in 2:16.3 and Harbin Wilks the high jump at 5-11.

Northwestern's Willis Barr vaulted 11 feet to spark the Colts to a 68-23 rout of Western. Clyde Howard was a triple winner, taking the hurdles and the high jump. Western had winners in Dan Norwood, at 5:00 for the mile, and Pete Bernek, at 26.6 for the 220.
