Leon Burton, Flint Northern star, tied a field house record of :06.2 in the 60-yard dash in defeating Pontiac's Alonzo Harris by less than a stride.

Burton's time tied the mark set a year ago by Jim Bailey, of Miami University.

Three other field house records were set in the 17-event program.

WAYNE'S MARK SMITH turned in a record :07.3 effort in winning the 65-yard low hurdles. Western Michigan's Al Renick lowered his own field house record in the 65-yard high hurdles when he was clocked in :08 flat.

Miami's Tom Jones heaved the shot 53 feet, 2¼ inches, for another record.

Wayne had another winner in Billie Smith, who high jumped 6'1½ inches.

Miami won five of the 12 first places in the college division.
