

BURTON BEATEN

Harris Wins Feud, But Northern Tops Prep Track Test

MT. PLEASANT — Alonzo Harris, of Pontiac, won his grudge match with Flint Northern's Leon Burton.

When the points were added, however, it was Northern who carried home the handsome team trophy in the second running of the Saginaw-Arthur Hill Invitational indoor track meet.

The Viking won only two firsts, the low hurdles and the sprint relay, but Northern picked up points in nine of the 12 events to roll up a winning 49 points.

Pontiac was second with 40½, followed by Saginaw 36½, Arthur Hill 34, Fordson 18, Traverse City 9½, Bay City Central 4½, Muskegon 4, Muskegon Heights 1.

The Harris-Burton duel was as good as advertised and supplied the major excitement for 1,500 fans.

Harris started out on the right foot when he leaped 22 feet, four inches, on his first broad jumping attempt. This is less than eight inches off the state record of 22 feet, 11½ inches held by Ted Tyocoki, of Lansing Central and set 15 years ago.

BURTON, who jumped 22-1½ only last Tuesday, finished a distance fifth. His best effort was 20 feet.

Harris then upset the Flint flash in the 60-yard dash, winning by an eye lash in :06.5. Two weeks ago in the Chip relays here, Burton tied the field house record when he clocked in :06.2.

Burton's lone victory came in the 45-yard low hurdles when he turned in a commendable :07.5 effort.

Fordson High, running in its first meet of the spring, didn't make the long trip for nothing.

GERRY ZENY, of Fordson, won the mile in 4:43 flat. Armand Vigna, another Tractor, placed second in the 800. Fordson surprised in the medley relay, a one and a half mile grind, when its quartet of Gene Gimac, Phil Davis, Don Bender, and Jack Ripper won in 6:25.

High point man of the meet was Arthur Hill's Bob Schlaefke, who placed second in both hurdles and the broad jump and tied for second in the high jump for an individual total of 14½ points.
