

# Ludington Break 2 Records in Indoor Meet

The Ludington track team finished in a tie for fourth in the invitational indoor track meet at Central Michigan college Saturday—breaking two records and showing a lot of promise.

The Orioles host Muskegon Heights, weather permitting, at 5:30 p. m. Tuesday at Oriole field in their first outdoor action of the season.

It will be the first stiff test for the Oriole finalists who face a heavy schedule this season. A late start has hampered the squad somewhat but they didn't show it Saturday.

Potent Mt. Pleasant, with months of training behind them in the big Central Michigan college fieldhouse, won the invitational Saturday, being pressed by Big Rapids. Mt. Pleasant amassed 26 points. Big Rapids was second with 22. Roseville had 18 and Ludington and Alma had 15½. Cadillac, the only other conference team entered Saturday had four points. Traverse City who competed in the A division Friday and finished sixth will compete in the conference meet in May which is shaping up as one of the tightest in the history of the league.

Lee Snyder who pole vaulted 116½ broke the meet record and the middle distance relay team of Jack Heglund, Pete Tillotson, Dick Newberg and Parvin Wright set a record in winning that event in 6:27.

Tom Johnson was second in the fourth heat in the 65-high hurdle preliminaries with a 8.84—trailing Gary Gregg of Big Rapids by .04 of a second. In the semi-finals he was third with a 9. behind Gregg and Jack Kerechhof of Roseville.

In the low hurdles Johnson was first in heat two with a 8.55, was second in the semifinals with a 8.5 behind Gregg and finished third in the finals with an 8.4.

In the shot put Snyder was third with 44'2½" to tie with Don Kirkconnell of Mt. Pleasant.
