

Girls Compete at Dort Field To Settle County Track Title

Girls took the sport spotlight in Genesee County League this afternoon as the lassies met at Dort Field to compete in the annual girls' track meet.

Kearsley and Otisville went in defense of their 1952 championships today in Class B and C, respectively. The annual affair started at 2:30 P. M. and the last race was scheduled for 4:30.

The girls compete in nine events. They are standing broad jump, running broad jump, shot put, softball throw, basketball throw, hop-step and jump, 200-yard relay, 75-yard dash and 50-yard dash.

In winning last year's meet, Kearsley's gals copped four first

places and beat second-place Flushing by a two-to-one ratio. Otisville had a tougher time in nipping Goodrich by eight points.

Kearsley holds the lioness's share of the County Class B meet records. The female Hornets have the record in the standing broad jump, softball throw and 200-yard dash while sharing the record in the 75-yard dash and 50-yard dash.

Goodrich, with the aid of Nancy Fell, holds the most Class C standards. Miss Fell alone holds the record in three events, standing broad jump, shot put and basketball throw. The Goodrich relay team of 1951 also holds a record.
