Kearsley Girls Cop B Track Title

Shirley Young Breaks Dash Record; Class C Crown Won by Otisville

Sparked by the record-breaking performance of petite, pretty Shirley Young, the Kearsley High girls' copped the Genesee County girls' Class B track crown with ease at Dort Field Thursday afternoon.

In the Class C' division, the Otisville Spartanettes gained the other title by whipping all competition. Both Kearsley and Otisville were defending champions.

High point of the meet Thursday was the record-shattering dash of Miss Young over the 75-yard distance. She sped down the cinders and was clocked at 9.4 seconds, shaving a tenth of a second off the old mark set in 1947.

Kearsley amassed 54 points, overshadowing second-place Beecher which totaled 29 points. The female Hornets captured six of the eight first places. Twenty-nine of the winner's 54 points were contributed by 2 girls. Miss Young was the meet's top point-getter with 15.

The athletic blonde also won the standing broad jump, the

hop-step-and-jump and anchored the 200-yard relay team. Her teammate, Mary Jane Kenny, netted 14 points by winning the running broad jump, shot put and gaining second in the 75-yard dash. She was also a member of the winning relay team along with Mary Ellen Goulish and Shirley Gustafson.

The other two first places were taken by Beecher's Delores Elsingner in the softball throw and Davison's Margy Bedtelyon in the basketball throw.

Following Beecher in the final results were Davison 11½, Flushing 9½, Bendle 9 and Grand Blanc 7.

The Spartanettes scored 34½ points to defeat second-place Mandeville which scored 26½. The winners had too much depth for the league.

Although Otisville copped only three first places, they won the meet on the pair of seconds and three third places. Nellie Barden of Otisville was the top point-getter in Class C with 14. Miss Barden took firsts in the running broad jump and the shot put and a second in the basketball throw. Otisville's other first came with Gail McCormick's winning time in the 75-yard dash.

Mandeville took two firsts on Ilene Johnson's basketball throw and the relay team of Doris Sincoc, Nan Thomas, Miss Johnson and Joan Russell. Goodrich had two firsts, with Kay Scott in the standing broad jump and Gloria Johnson in the hop-step-and-jump. The other first place was captured by Bentley's Pat Curry in the softball throw. Following second-place Mandeville were Goodrich 20½, Dye 11, Swartz Creek 10½, Bentley 10, Linden 6 and Utley 1.
