

Saginaw Wins Title On Balance

Arthur Hill Takes Only One First

MT. PLEASANT — Saginaw Arthur Hill won only one first place, but the Lumberjacks had enough balance and just the necessary luck to win their third straight Class A title in the 13th annual Central Mich-

THE UNFORTUNATE accident eventually cost Northern the title. Had the Vikings ever finished fourth they would have added two more points and could have won the trophy.

Arthur Hill's lone triumph came in the shuttle hurdle relay. The Lumberjacks, however, scored in 12 of the 16 events.

A middle distance relay team from St. Joseph's, of Detroit, made its long trip pay-off with a victory. George Fiedler, John Lewandowski, Frank Prokop and Don Bubuck, toured the mile and one half layout in 6:19.1 to win by 20 yards over second
