Number Of Area Thinclads Win Places

A dozen records were smashed and two others tied Saturday in the dizzy, time-shattering finals of the Michigan High School Athletic Association's track championships held at Lansing and Ann Arbor.

FLINT NORTHERN won the Class A title with 37 points. Pontiac was second with 24 and Kalamazoo third with 18.

Lakeview ousted defending champion Roseville by a scant two points for the Class B crown. Lakeview tallied 20 points, Roseville 18.

St. Louis won the Class C team title with 30 points. Berrien Springs was second with 22½.

Norman-Dickson Brethren, repeated as Class D champion, piling up a staggering total of 67½ points.

While District athletes failed to capture a first place in any of the events, a number did win places.

IN CLASS B Marysville's Jack Force and Cass City's Bob Wallace tied for third in the pole vault at 11'6". Gale Erbe, Bad Axe, fourth shot put; Tim Burdon, Cass City, fourth broad jump.

In Class C Bob Gangler, Unionville placed third in the mile run. Jim Smith, Algonac tied for fifth in the pole vault. Marlette's Tom Lisk placed fourth in the high hurdles and fifth in the broad jump.

Ken Maxwell, Marlette, placed first in the second heat of the 880 yard dash and Joe McKoan, Algonac took second in the shot put.
