

Pickford, Houghton, Marquette Win U. P. Track, Field Crowns

MARQUETTE — In successfully defending its Class B & E Upper Peninsula track and field title here Saturday, Pickford established three new Northern Michigan records.

Headed by Jim Graham and Edward Leach, Pickford was the only high school to represent an U. P. title.

Marquette being out South High School to top Class B honors while Houghton dominated Class C competition. The U. P. championship was the first ever won by the Marquette school.

Three athletes shipped to new marks here Saturday in the half-mile, quarter-mile and mile relays. The only other record set was in Class C women's 200-yard relay race to victory in 2:34, the old mark was 2:47.

Pickford record-breakers were Don Ray in the 800 and Jim Graham in the 400. Ray surpassed the 2000 yard mark in 2:12.5 to better the old record of 2:17 set by Fred Strick of Okama in 1941.

Graham won the 400 in 35.45 to better the old standard of 38.8 established in 1947 by John Dove of Chassell.

The 800 relay team of Edward

Leach, Jim Graham, Jim Quinnell and Roland McCready raced to victory in 1:39.45. The old mark of 1:37.5 was set in 1932 by Channing Leach won the individual 800 for 1:35.5.

Class B competition was all-around. Charles Roberts filled in capably for Edward in the half-mile relay and led the pack in the 200-yard dash.

UPIAC Track Crown Won By Sault Tech

Sault Tech's powerful track and field team scored 30 1/2 points in its second annual U. P. Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship Saturday at Marquette.

Team Sault Tech scored 30 1/2 points, 11 points ahead of Northland, 25 points behind Marquette.

Of the eight Northern conference, only Sault Tech scored five more points. All but three of the entire team scored one point or more.
