# Miller Barely Misses Mark for Points in Track Finals

Miller High's track athletes set their sights on three goals in the Metropolitan League track meet at Denby yesterday. Winning the team title for the second year, naturally was the first of their aims but they also wanted to crack the half-mile relay record and hang up a 'modern' scoring mark.

They attained the first two objectives and just missed the third.

Scoring in 11 of the 13 events, Miller won with 69½ points as

Northwestern, the runnerup, was able to get only 36. The Miller relay of Rex McLeod, John Massingille, Godfrey Little and Don Thomas was caught in 1:30.6, breaking the record of 1:31 set by Northern two years ago.

### SECOND HIGHEST

The total of 69½ points is second only to the 75 another Miller squad rolled up in 1950. That is high for the present scoring system of 6-5-4-3-2-1. Miller scored 105 points in 1945 when the scoring was more liberal with 10-8-6-4-2-1.

There were two double winners and Miller had both. Thomas, who ran anchor on the record breaking sprint relay, swept to victories in the 100 and 220, while Lloyd Swanson led in high and low hurdles.

In all, Miller had seven firsts and tied another. Besides the sprints, hurdles and relay, it won the broad jump and shot put, tying in the high jump. Godfrey Little leaped 22 feet 9½ and Bob McClendon got off a mighty heave of 52 feet 11¾ with the shot. McLeod and Jess Cokely, North-

eastern, cleared six feet in the high jump.

A record of 2:29.9 was set in the medley by Northern's quartet of Dave Benson, Don McCuin, Dennis Gibson and Lee Daniels. The old time, by Southwestern last year, was 2:32.

Dick Anderson, Redford, and Willie Adkins, Northeastern, tied in the pole vault at 11 feet 8. Other winners were Paris Whittington, Cass, 440; Jay McKensie, Pershing, half mile and Ken Santer, Redford, mile.
