

4 VICTORIES NOT ENOUGH

One-Man Track Team Fails for Northeastern

Northeastern's veteran Willie Adkins produced a maximum four-event slam Thursday, but could not save the Falcons from a 64-27 indoor track and field loss to powerful Northern.

Adkins won the pole vault at 10 feet 6 inches, the high jump at 5-8 and both hurdle races. The hurdle events were not timed. The victories were worth 20 points.

Northern captured seven events, including a double by Clarence Willis in the 220 and 25-yard dashes.

WESTERN WON its third straight meet, beating Cody 58½ to 41½, with the help of a hurdle double victory by Al Marmion . . . Denby tripped Cass Tech, 50½ to 40½, with Phil Eckman running a 4:15.5 mflie . . . Northwestern whipped Mackenzie, 54 to 37, with Maxie Harris winning the sprints and anchoring a winning relay unit for 11¼ points.

Eastern's medley relay squad bettered its old record by three-tenths of a second in 2:15.4 as the Indians routed Southeastern, 60 to 31.
