

Marlette Cops Class C Title

As Chips Track Relays Close

Mt. Pleasant, May 1 — AP — Saginaw High in Class A and little Marlette in Class C emerged as champions Saturday in Central Michigan College's relays for high school athletes.

COMPETITION IN the two classes wound up the two-day classic. Mt. Pleasant High won the Class B and Norman-Dickson the Class D championships Friday.

In Class A, Saginaw High, with 59 7/10 points edged out Flint Northern which had 58 3/5. Saginaw Arthur Hill, which had won the title for three years in a row, finished third with 47 1/5.

Saginaw High, coached by Herb Korf, set a new mark in the Central 660-yard relay with the time of 1:07.85. St. Joseph of Detroit broke the meet record for the middle distance relay by posting a time of 6:02.7. Ed Ringgold of Pontiac jumped 21 feet 11 1/2 inches for a new mark in the broad jump. Ringgold also won the high jump in 5 feet 11 inches.

The Flint Northern team of James Logan, Ernest Lanown, Art Johnson and Dave Copeland ran the 880-yard relay in 1:32.2 for a new mark.

COACH WENDELL Brenner's "Red Raiders" from Marlette were first in Class C in a field of 59 prep teams from all parts of the state. Marlette amassed 40 points but won only three firsts in the 16 events. Marlette won the mile relay and Tom Lick captured the 120-yard high and 180-yard low hurdles.

New records also were set by Class C athletes. Dave Whiffell of Shelby set a new mark in the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet 2 1/2 inches. He also won the shot-put with 47 feet 3 1/2 inches.

A new record was set in the high jump by Jim Vollmer of A. E. Smith, Wyandotte. Vollmer jumped 5 feet 10 7/8 inches.
