

Saginaw Takes Class A Title

ANN ARBOR —(AP)—Saginaw High School, which had been looking at the backs of Flint Northern runners all afternoon, capitalized on their pole vaulter to win the Class A title of the Michigan High School track and field championship Saturday.

Little Lansing Everett, a 300-student institution which had never before taken a state track title, walked off Michigan's Ferry Field with the Class C title.

Saginaw, which took a bad point beating in the broad jump when two of its best jumpers failed to qualify, slipped out with 35 points. Flint Northern, who led until the final event, had 32 points. Third in Class A was Saginaw Arthur Hill with 23.

Everett was ahead all the way and easily showed its dominance with 26½ points. Trailing in second was Marlette with 20 points while Cassopolis was third with 17½ points.

Four state records fell, two in each class. The thriller of the day was Joel Boyden's 57-foot toss of the shot put. The 265-pound Muskegon High senior who stands 6-6, bettered the 54-4¼ mark set by Tom Johnson of Muskegon Heights in 1948.
