Canadian Tugboat Wins Race Third Time in Detroit

Detroit—AP—The 600-horse-power Atomic, owned by Capt. J. Earl McQueen of nearby Amherstburg, Ont., Saturday won the International tugboat race on the Detroit River for the third time in the event's five-year history.

The victory returned the Eng-land Trophy to Canada after it was captured in the last two races by tugs owned by John Roen, Sturgeon Bay, Wis.

The 1,000-horsepower Mary-land and the Wisconsin, 750-horsepower, placed second and third, respectively.
