Last Sunday upon conclusion of a game here, General Manager Frank Lane of the Chicago White Sox announced the acquisition of George Kell from the Boston Red Sox.

THE BALTIMORE Orioles followed the White Sox into Eriggs Stadium Tuesday and General Manager Art Ehlers promptly announced the purchase of outfielder Cal Abrams from Pittsburgh of the National League.

In return for Abrams, the Orioles gave up ex-Tiger pitcher Dick Littlefield and an unannounced sum of cash.

Abrams is a left-handed hitter who formerly played with the Brooklyn Dodgers. He hit .256 last season.

Stakes High For Davey In TV Bout

CHICAGO — (AP) — Chuck Davey, boxing's onetime glamor boy, will have more to lose than just the fight Wednesday night when he attempts to climb back into the welterweight title rankings against youthful Vince Martinez. It will be televised over WJBK-TV Channel 2 at 9 p.m. Davey, rated the 2-to-1 underdog for the bout, has signed a contract for a flat 25 per cent of the gate for a return match with Art Aragon in Los Angeles July 1.

If he wins "big" from Martinez, and on television at that, his share of the July 1 battle could be far above the \$25,000 he reportedly was to be guaranteed.

If he should lose to Martinez on television, his fare to the Coast might surpass his share of the purse against Aragon.

A victory for Davey could help his chances for a rematch with Welterweight Titleholder Kid Gavilan, too, and should the former Michigan State scrapper win, then Martinez, a 22-year-old can defer his title hopes for some
