

-Coaches Winning Team, Gives Credit to Another

Brother Christopher modestly disclaimed any credit for the victory as the St. Joseph High track team carried him off the field at U. of D. after winning the Parochial League championship yesterday.

"The credit belongs to Brother James," the winning coach said. "Brother James developed last year's team and most of the boys were back again. I simply took over when he was transferred."

The substitute coach saw his boys pile up 65 points to retain the league's track honors. De La Salle finished in second place with 46 points, Orchard Lake St. Mary having 34. Four other schools scored. Servite had 26, St. Bernard 23, St. Paul 3 and St. Thomas 2.

Two meet records were broken. Bob Paquet, of St. Bernard, was timed in 15.8 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles while Leroy Pellerin, St. Joseph, won the mile run in 4:41.2.

John Lewandowski, St. Joseph, was the only double win-

ner. He took the 100 and 220-yard dashes besides running the first leg of the half-mile relay.

St. Joseph had eight seconds, four seconds and three thirds.
