

'53 Winner Qualifies 14 for Finals

A two-team battle looms in the Metropolitan League's West Side track finals after yesterday's preliminaries at Mackenzie.

Northwestern, the defender, qualified the most—14. Cooley had 11, with Mackenzie and Redford each placing 10. Mackenzie, however, figured to give Northwestern a battle tomorrow because of concentrated strength in the high and low hurdles. Norm Zackiewicz and Covert Lefler had a good chance to place first in second in both races.

Two events were finished yesterday. Tom Sandweiss, Mumford, won the shot put with a heave of 48 feet 9 inches, as Wayne Basham, Western, and Clyde Manis, Redford, tied at 10 feet 10 in the pole vault.

No trials were held in the medley and sprint relays, high and broad jumps.
