After Nine Track Titles, Miller Loses to Pershing by 2-3 Point

High is enjoying the greatest Athletics success in the school's history.

Pershing won the Metropolitan League cross country and football championships for the first time last fall. Then yesterday, in the closest down-to-thewire finish, Pershing gained the East Side track title by one-third of a point over Miller, champion for the last nine years.

There was more excitement than usual. The meet was close all the way and the crowd was kept on edge as the running score was announced after each event.

LESS THAN POINT

With only the half-mile relay remaining, Miller led, 65% to 65, and was favored to beat Pershing! as it did in the Wayne Relays.

It didn't turn out as expected. Pershing and Miller ran in the same heat, and Al Wright. Pershing's first runner, picked up a long lead. His teammates lost little ground. Pershing placed fourth and Miller fifth on time. The three points gave Pershing 68 to Miller's 67%.

Other schools were far back. Northern had 35, followed by Cass, 33; Eastern, 31 5/6; Northeastern, 22; Southeastern, 91/2; Denby, 4.

KEY MAN IN DRIVE

Wright was the key man in the closing drive, placing second in the low hurdles when he hadn't been figured on for better than fourth, and third in the broad jump. He opened the meet with a surprise victory over favorite John Dowdell, of Miller, in the high hurdles and was Pershing's high scorer with 1534 points.

Willie Adkins, of Northeastern, was the meet's individual' star. He scored 21 points on firsts in the low hurdles and pole vault, a tie for first in the high jump and second in the broad jump. The 18-year old one-man team won the hurdles in 12.9 seconds, clipping a tenth of a second off the old mark set by Willis Ward, Northwest-


