

Kingston Keeps Track Crown

UNIONVILLE — Although pressed by Fairgrove, Kingston High school thinclads retained their track crown in the Little Seven League by winning the conference championship for the second year in a row as the annual meet was staged under lights last night on the Unionville athletic field.

Only four of the eight league teams competed in the meet. Kingston was first with 84 points, Fairgrove was second with 75½, and Akron placed third with 34½. Owendale, the fourth team, scored only one point.

Kingston collected six first places and tied for another. Fairgrove won four firsts while Akron captured two and tied for a third.

Two league records fell by the wayside, in the high jump and pole vault.

Ray Allen and Jim Miller, both of Fairgrove, cleared 5 feet, 5 inches in the high jump to tie for first and break the previous conference mark of 5 feet, 3 inches set in 1954 by Harold Turner of Fairgrove, and Don Andrus, of Reese.

In the pole vault, Jerry Peters, of Kingston, cleared 9 feet, 6 inches to break his own record of 9 feet, 4 inches which he set last year.
