Five Big Ten **Grid Contests** To Be on TV

New York-AP-The Columbia Broadcasting System will telecast five Big Ten Conference and five Pacific Coast Conference football games next Fall under the 1955 NCAA regional television plan.
A CBS spokesman announced

agreements with the two groups Thursday and added that CBS had renewed a contract to televise Big Ten basketball games next Winter.

Also on the CBS schedule, it was announced, are the National Collegiate track and field championships at Los Angeles, June 18

The NCAA plan this year and NCAA plan this year—drawn up as a compromise with Big Ten and PCC regional telecast demands—calls for national telecasts on eight dates, including Thanksgiving Day, and five regional dates.
