

# Seven Marks Set in State Track Meets

## Pontiac Class A Champ, Inkster B, Reed City C, Brethren D

Ann Arbor — (AP) — All-powerful Pontiac, with 19 talented entries in 11 events, lived up to expectations over the week-end by capturing its first class A title in the state high school track championships. But a valiant one-man entry from Cassopolis stole the hearts of spectators.

Little Brethren put together another potent track team from its 100 students to win its fourth consecutive title in class D.

The class B title fell to Inkster while Reed City won the class C championship.

But Reed City's track squad had to fight it out with Henry McNary of Cassopolis to win its title. The never-say-die McNary rolled up 17 points, missing the class championship by only one-quarter of a point.

The Cassopolis speedster staged a terrific show, winning the 100 and 220-yard dashes and placing second in the broad jump.

A total of seven records fell in the doubleheader meets at East Lansing and Ann Arbor.

### Paced by Double Winner.

Pontiac, paced by double winner Hayes Jones, piled up 51 13/14 points with its great depth far outdistancing runnerup Flint Central's 17-point showing. Saginaw was third with 15 13/14.

Jones won the high hurdles—in record time—the broad jump and took second in the low hurdles. His record effort was a 14.5 second display in the 120-yard high hurdles, slicing two-tenths of a second off the old mark.

Other class A marks fell to Bill Campbell of Dearborn Fordson and his team's relay squad. Campbell was closed in 49.7 for the 440, three-tenths of a second faster than the former mark. Fordson eclipsed the medley relay mark with a 2:28.1 tour of the three-quarter mile. Flint Northern held the former relay record of 2:29.7.

No records fell in class C where Don Miller led Reed City to its first championship with firsts in the 120-yard high and 180-yard low hurdles.
