

Brethren, Inkster Win Track Meets

Ann Arbor — AP — Inkster High in Class B and Brethren High in Class D won State track meet championship here Saturday as four records were shattered.

Brethren, a school of 100 students in the Manistee Forest, won for the fourth straight season. For the second season in a row Brethren, Spring Arbor and Freesoil finished 1-2-3. The unusual situation found Breth-

ren with 46½ points, Spring Arbor with 33 and Freesoil with 21.

Brethren's Norman Burns and two cousins named Beane, Ken and Chuck, did most of the scoring for the Norsemen. Burns accounted for one Class D record, tossing the shot 42 feet, 3& inches. It broke a long-standing mark of 47.5, set in 1931 by Milt Glassner of Diamondale.

Burns also won one of two sections of the 440-yard dash. Ken Beane won the 100 while cousin Chuck placed behind teammate Walt Thomas in a 1-2 finish of the 220. That one race alone netted 11 big points for Brethren.

Then, Thomas, Burns and the Beane boys took the 880 relay.

The other Class D mark to fall was in the 880 run. Spring Arbor's Gordon Fitzgerald ran it in 2:04.2, breaking the old mark of 2:06.5 set by his former teammate Dave Heimberger last year.

In Class B, John Palmer, the fantastic 18-year-old junior from St. Louis, took two firsts, one of them a record-setting performance in the 180-yard low hurdles. In the preliminaries, Palmer equalled his former mark of 20.2 set last year. Then, in the finals, he bettered it with a 20.1.

Oddly, Palmer has done even better in the event and still holds the Class C record in the low hurdles—20 seconds flat.

Larry Masteller of Adrian, snapped the other Class B mark. He zipped over the 440-yard course in 50.6 seconds to break the record of 50.9 by James Wright of Berkley in 1933.

Pirates Lose Ninth in Row

Pittsburgh—AP—Relief pitchers Hoyt Wilhelm and Marv Grissom went to the mound in the ninth inning to halt a rally aided by an error and a passed ball and gave the resurgent New York Giants a 3-2 triumph over the faltering Pittsburgh Pirates.

It was the ninth consecutive loss for the punchless Pirates, one more than their longest previous losing streak this season. In the nine games, Pittsburgh scored only 11 runs.

The Giants went into the final stanza with a 3-1 edge but almost booted the win away.

Singles by Preston Ward and pinch hitter Jerry Lynch put two men aboard and manager Leo Durocher yanked starter Sal Maglie for Wilhelm.

A passed ball by catcher Ray Katt allowed Ward to score and Lynch to advance to second. Sid Gordon came up as a pinch hitter and struck out, but Katt let the ball get away and Gordon reached first safely.

Durocher then called on Grissom who got Roberto Clemente to fly out to end the inning.

Maglie got credit for the triumph, his fourth against three losses.
