Newberry Relay Team Sets New U. P. Record

Stephenson 'B' Titlist

ESCANABA — Stephenson High School capped a highly successful track and field season here Saturday by winning the Upper Peninsula Class B championship.

Stephenson — which placed first in only one event — outdistanced runner-up Iron River by more than eight points.

Coached by Bill Jennings, the Newberry Indians placed third with 18.9 points while Sault Ste. Marie and Kingsford shared fourth place with 18 points.

Final point totals: Stephenson, 36.9; Iron River, 28; Newberry, 18.9; Kingsford, 18; Sault, 18; Calumet, 16.4; Menominee, 15.5; Ishpeming, 15; Manistique, 12.9; Munising, 10; Marquette, 9.9; Negaunee, 7; Hancock, 6.8; Iron Mountain, 6; Ironwood, 4; Escanaba, 4.

New records were established by Newberry's medley relay team and Gary Leslie of Munising, a sensational miler.

The Newberry team, consisting of Joe Marcey, Gary Teske, Dave McLean and Frank Holmborg, stepped off the three-quarter mile relay in the record time of 2:38.9. The old mark of 2:40.8 was set in 1950 by Sault Ste. Marie.

DeLisle, clipped more than five seconds off the mile mark. DeLisle was clocked in 4:45.2. The old record of 4:40.8 was set in 1941 by Eugene Danielson of Wakefield.

Eddie Vergara of Iron River was one of the individual stars. The speedster tied the century mark of 10.4, which was set in 1946 by Walter Olson of Ironwood and tied in 1950 by Kenneth Hofer of Stephenson and Robert MacDonald of Newberry.

Sault Ste. Marie and Newberry teamed up to cop three first places. Dave Wise of the Sault won the 120-yard high hurdles and another Sault runner, Jim Stafford, copped the 800-yard run.

Newberry's lone victory came in the medley relay.
