

4th Straight Title to Utica

Miss Coval, who reigned as Michigan Peach Queen in 1952, when Malzahn, a junior speedster, sparked Utica to a record-setting fourth straight Bi-County League track and field championship yesterday.

Incidentally, Miss Coval's successor as Peach Queen, Nancy Seeman, only recently became engaged to Tiger pitcher Duke Maas. Both girls are from Utica.

Wins Low and High

Malzahn set one of five records established on the new Lakeview High athletic field as

he won the 180-yard low hurdles in 20.7 seconds. He also won the high hurdles in 15.5. It was in the latter event that he won the state Class B championship Saturday.

Coupled with a third in the broad jump and additional points for running the lead leg of the sprint relay, Malzahn finished with a personal tally of 17½ of Utica's 61½ total. The relay squad's time of 1:34.3 also set a league mark.

Crellin's Fame Fleeting

A record that had been in the books since 1934 fell when Fred Schwartz of Warren won the mile in 4:57.8, erasing by one second the old mark held by Jack Crellin of Lake Shore, now Detroit Times labor writer. Other records set came in the medley relay by Utica, 2:39.15, and by Center Line's John Shirchak in the broad jump, 21' 5½".

Utica won five events while second-place Center Line took two outright and tied for two others in compiling 49 points. Double winners were Frank Topolewski, who also tallied 17½ points, in the 100-yard dash and a tie in the 220 and Shirchak in the broad jump and a tie in the high jump. Other team scores were Lake Shore 43, Eastland

32, Warren 27, Lakeview 26, and South Lake, 10½.

Tom Trammel hurled a one-hitter and fanned 10 in a five-inning game halted by rain, but it was good enough to give Fraser a 2-1 victory over Country Day and the Southeastern Suburban baseball pennant. It was Trammel's third one-hitter of the season. A triple by Jack Forbes drove in the key run in the third.
