Track Keeps Bus Driver on Run

HALTED BY RAIN

Only five events were completed in the Parochial meet yesterday before the downpour

forced the remainder of the program to be postponed. Servite piled up 24 points against 13 for St. Joseph, the defending champion, and De La Salle. St. Bernard had 11, Austin 7, Orchard Lake St. Mary 6 and Notre Dame 1.

Servite won the medley relay, tied for first in the pole vault and placed in the other tests.

"I always liked track but wasn't very good at it in high school and my best was to run on a relay in a gym class," Foley said. "But I was drafted to coach track at St. Rose a few years ago and have continued it at Servite. What little I know about the sport I've learned the hard way."

HOPES DIMMED

St. Joseph's hopes of winning its third straight title were dimmed when Don Gheysens suffered a torn cartilage in the state meet at East Lansing last week. "He was a sure bet to give us 15 points in the high and low hurdles and the broad jump," Brother Christopher said.

With Don limping along the track's edge St. Joseph failed to place in the high hurdles.

Trials were completed in four events of the Metropolitan League's West Side meet on the Mumford track. The rest were scheduled today with the finals
