# Tradition Maintained at Miller

Leroy Dues had an explanation for Miller High's one-sided victory in the Metropolitan League East Side track meet yesterday. "It's a combination of things — tradition, enthusiasm and hard work," the mild-mannered coach said.

"Our boys like the sport and strive to better themselves, but they also want to be as good as other teams we've had."

Miller completely dominated the meet, rolling up 95½ points to regain the title it lost to Pershing by a third of a point last year. Denby, the host school, was second with 56¾ and Pershing scored 42¾ to take third. Cass had 27¾, Northern 17, Northeastern 14¼, Eastern 11½, Southeastern 6½.

Miller athletes placed first in seven of the 13 events, were second in two and tied for second in two.

Jerry Green, 17-year-old senior, was the individual star with 19¼ points. He was first in the 100, 220 and broad jump and ran the first leg on Miller's sprint relay which finished second to Northern.

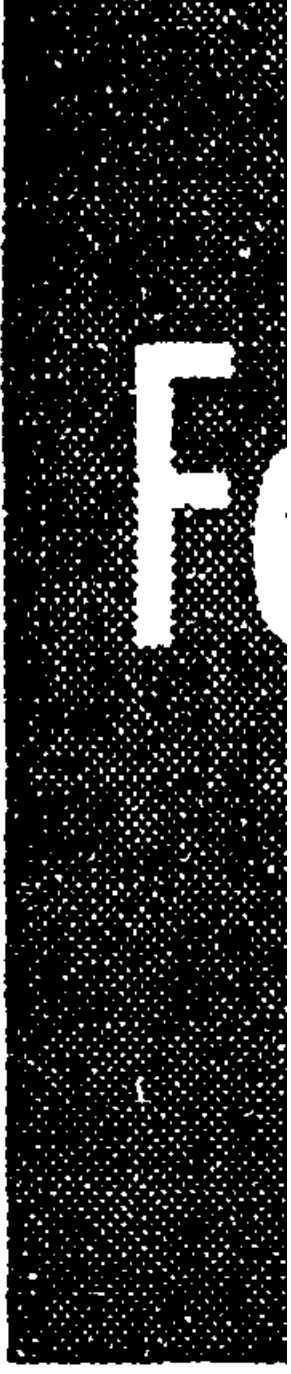

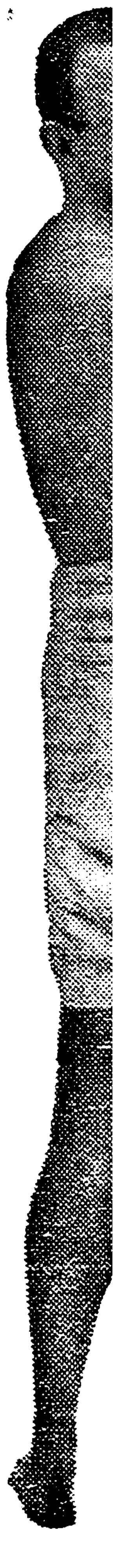
