

Pontiac Wins Ohio Relays

MANSFIELD, Ohio — (AP) — The Chiefs of Pontiac, Mich., making their first appearance in the event, yesterday became the first non-Ohio team to win the 25-year-old Mansfield High School Relays.

The well-balanced proteges of Coach Wally Schloerke scored in nine of the 18 events to pile up an imposing 34½ points and defeat Mount Lebanon, Pa., by 10½.

Jones Sets Pace
Lakewood was the No. 1 Ohio team with 22 points.

Hayes Jones, fleet-footed Pontiac star, was the big difference as he won the high hurdles and broad jump and finished second in the low hurdles for 16 of his team's points.

No visiting team had ever finished better than third in the annual cinder carnival, but the invaders dominated the events which were run off in a dust, wind and rain storm.

Six new records went into the books and another was tied with Mount Lebanon getting three of the new marks and Pontiac tying for one.

4:29.5 Mile
Mount Lebanon's 24 points came on four first places and the keystone stagers set new records for the mile and four-mile relays and sent Carl Weisiger to a 4:29.5 mile which erased the 4:31.9 set in 1939 by Akron South's Ray Jordan.

Howard Nourse of Springfield High jumped 6 feet 6¼ inches to beat the 1938 record of 6-5½ set by Charles O'Rourke of Warren Harding.

Jones of Pontiac tied the 180-yard low hurdle mark of 19.4 and Bob Reublin, the only entrant from Olmsted Falls, tossed the shot 54 feet, 7½ inches for a new record in that event.

Lakewood's 1:31 effort in the 880-yard relay rounded out the record breaking performances.
