

Lansing Eastern 3rd Team In Central Track Carnival

MT. PLEASANT, April 7 (AP)—Hayes Jones broke three meet records, won three events and tied for first in another as his Pontiac high school team romped to an easy victory in defending its championship last night in the Saginaw-Arthur Hill invitational track meet at Central Michigan college.

The Pontiac medley relay team also broke a meet record as the defending champs rolled up 61 points to second-place Flint Northern's 34.

Trailing Pontiac and Flint Northern were: Lansing Eastern, 19 points; Bay City Central, 14; Muskegon, 11½; Saginaw-Arthur Hill, 11; Traverse City, 8; Saginaw, 7½; Midland, 5½; Alpena, 5; Flint Central, 3½.

Only Bay City Handy failed to score in the indoor meet, jointly sponsored by Saginaw and Saginaw-Arthur Hill high schools, in the Central Michigan college fieldhouse.

Coach Tom Morris' Quakers did not win a first place, but had two seconds, two thirds, two fourths and a fifth.

Miller Art Vaillencourt was second and the four-lap relay team of Willie Austin, Bill Daily, Jack Sisco and Joe Malatinsky was second. Dave Brown was fourth in the mile.

Dick Bailey was third in the pole vault and the middle-distance relay team of Sid Curry, Malatinsky, Ken Rinehard and Don Hough was third, barely nipped by Flint Northern.

Ben Bolt was fourth in the 440 and Bill Daily was fifth in the 60-yard dash.

Jones shattered the 65-yard high hurdles record in winning the event in 7.8 seconds, compared with the meet record of :8.15 set by Tom Hall of Saginaw in 1954.

Jones jumped 22 feet 9½ inches to win the broad jump, bettering the old record of 22 feet 4 inches set in 1953 by Alonzo Harris of Pontiac.

Then Jones tied with Hudson Ray, Pontiac teammate, for first place in the high jump. Each cleared 6 feet 1¾ inches to top the record of 6-feet-1 set by Ed Ringgold of Pontiac in 1954.

Capping his performance, Jones won the 65-yard low hurdles in :7.4, compared with a meet record of :7.35.

Pontiac's medley relay team won its event in 6 minutes 11 seconds, bettering the meet mark of 5:13 set by Traverse City in 1954.

Thelvis Winiecke of Saginaw-Arthur Hill won the shot put with a toss of 52 feet 8½ inches and broke a fifth meet record. The old mark was 52 feet 4½ inches set by Joel Boyden of Muskegon in 1954.
