

## Trojans Place Seventh in Track Opener; Pontiac Wins

Pontiac's powerful Chiefs far outdistanced the 12 team Class A invitational track meet Friday evening at the Central Michigan field house, more than doubling the point total of their closest rival, Flint Northern, who finished a distant second. Traverse City's Trojans finished a disappointing seventh but still were ahead of all other Arrowhead teams.

Five new meet records were set during the evening and members of the Pontiac team took part in four of them. Hayes Jones, one of the finest track athletes in the state, personally hid a hand in three of them as he set a new mark in the broad jump, 22 ft. 9 1/2 inches, tying in the high jump with a team mate. Hudson Bay with a 6 ft. 1 3/4 effort, and a new mark in the 60 yard high hurdles, a 7.8 reading. The record is tied college time in the nation for that distance in 7.5, so fans are sure that he really was moving.

The Pontiac team set a new meet mark when they ran two half miles and two 400 in 8:11. The team broke the shot put mark during the evening with a hoove of 22 ft. 8 1/8 inches to share in the record rewriting.

Traverse City athletes didn't work up the points they were expected to, but the fact that undoubtedly had much to do with it. Ken Chaseman reached the finish in the high hurdles before having out and Dick Beale did the same in the 60 yard dash. He just missed in a basket finish in the 800 with Albert's Pete Dyer. In this event, Dick Beale took two trials in qualifying heats in the low hurdles, then chased Hayes Jones of Pontiac in the final to take a good second place.

The 400 race was run in two sections with the five best times of the event placing. Grant Benson's 57.11 was good enough for a fifth place in the combined times.

Traverse City took a second place in their heat of the medley relay, but a new record in the event, which dropped them down when the best times of the two heats were treated, an indication of the fact that the winning time was almost 18 seconds faster than the Trojans team. Amos Central placed in the four lap relay but faster times dropped them out of the event. John Watson, Dick Beale, Tom Smith and Gary Longmore ran well though in their lack of speed.

Bob Seaborn, Bob Smith, Bill Durrill and Don Higgins occupied a second place in their heat of the medley event but they were forced to settle for a fifth when faster times in the other heat dropped them down.

Field events, long a sore spot in track at Central showed strength that might help them before the season is over. Gary Longmore just missed playing in the broad jump, but certainly will be a point maker before the season is over. Gary Beak did well in the shot put to grab a fifth place with 46 feet and he certainly will improve that distance. Bob Thompson tied for fifth in the pole vault and this will show improvement as these athletes have had very little work to date. Ken Chaseman pulled a muscle in the high jump and had to withdraw. That hurt Traverse City's chances of moving nearer the leaders.

Pontiac's champions, repeaters from last year grabbed eight first places in the 12 events. They missed competitors in the 60 yard dash and the pole vault and took a third in the 400 and a fourth in the shot put to cap a brilliant display of strength. Without a doubt they are the finest high school track team in the history of Michigan high school sports events.
