Kearsley, Swartz Creek Keep Girls' Track Titles

Strong depth carried Kearsley and Swartz Creek to easy
victories Friday in the annual
Genesee County girls' track
meet at Dort Field. It marked
the sixth straight Class B title
for Kearsley and the second in
a row for Swartz Cheek.

Two records were set and a third equaled in the meet which was postponed one day because of rain. But the damp track didn't bother the victors. Kearsley finished with 47 points, 19 ahead of second-place Mandeville. Swartz Creek had a 15-point bulge over Utley, 41.26.

Eleanor Hall of Kearsley broke the only Class B record with a leap of 32 feet, 6 inches in the hop, step and jump, smashing a 7-year-old mark. Delores Sabbadino of Beecher set the old record in 1949 at 32 feet, 2½ inches.

Utley's Pat Childers, who set the running broad jump record two years ago as a freshman, equaled the 75-yard dash time of 9.6 seconds. She now shares the Class C standard with Mandeville's Mary Donoghue who first ran it in 1951.

The only Class C record to go by the boards was the hop, step and jump. Maryla Gilbert of Gaines went 31 feet, 11½ inches this season, breaking the old mark of 30 feet, 6½ inches set by Mary Shepherd of Gaines in 1949.

The team depth of the two winners took its toll on the rest of the league. Kearsley won two first places, three seconds, three thirds, seven fourths and two fifths. Swartz Creek copped three firsts, four seconds, two thirds, a fourth, and two fifths.

Besides Miss Hall's first place, Kearsley's Virginia Greenman flipped the eight-pound shot 32 feet, 6 inches for the best effort of the afternoon. Second-place Mandeville took four first places. The Spartanettes copped both relay races, Suzle Hill took the standing broad jump and Joan Russell won the 75-yard dash. The 200-yard relay winning team was composed of Mary Russell, liane Gage, Miss Hill and Colleen Nickel. The long relay was won by the sextet of Miss Gage, Linda Becker, Beverly Neimey-eight and J. Russell.
