Jones almost personally out-scored runnerup Flint Northern as Pontiac piled up a record 61 points to Northern's 26. Besides his record-breaking victories, Jones also won the low hurdles and ran on Pontiac's winning regist relay.

In Class B, sprinter Charles Kyser paced Inkster to its third team title in a row. Kyser won both the sprints and anchored Inkster's winning 880-yard relay which set a new record of 1:31.0 to top the old mark of 1:31.4 Inkster had set in 1954.

The relay victory enabled Inkster to total 33 points, one more than runnerup St. Louis. Suburban River Rouge and Utica followed.

John Palmer made St. Louis a rough customer as he won the 180-yard low hurdles in the record time of 20 seconds flat, nipping a tenth off the record he set last year. He also was second in the broad jump, third in the shot put and fifth in the high hurdles. Utica's medley relya's time of 2:31.9 set another record.
