## 2 Records By Jones

Individual records went by the boards 10 times... the wind nullified at least three other super performances... and Pontiac (Class A) and Inkster (B) repeated as team champs.

These were the highlights of Saturday's state high school track championships at Ann Arbor and East Lansing, along with the team victories of Lansing Everett in Class C and Covert in Class D.

To nobody's surprise, the big record splasher was Pontiac's Hayes Jones, who erased a 20-year standard in the broad jump with a leap of 23 feet 8 7/8 inches and topped his own one-year mark by a tenth of a second with a :14.4 clocking in the 120-yard low hurdles.

### Personal Triumph

Jones almost personally outscored runnerup Flint Northern as Pontiac piled up a record 61 points to Northern's 26. Besides his record-breaking victories, Jones also won the low hurdles and ran on Pontiac's winning sprint relay.

In the broad jump, it took Jones three leaps to "warm up." Then four straight times he bettered the mark which Ted Tycocki of Lansing Central set in 1936. In the high hurdles, too, strong a wind in the preliminaries cost Jones a record of 14.2 seconds.

Bob Lakes of Kalamazoo Central turned in the other "A" record with a 1:58.9 clocking in the half-mile, a tenth under the old mark.

### Kyser Is Star

In Class B, sprinter Charles Kyser paced Inkster to its third team title in a row. Kyser won both the sprints and anchored Inkster's winning 880-yard relay which set a new record of 1:31.0 to top the old mark of 1:31.4 Inkster had set in 1954.

The relay victory enabled Inkster to total 33 points, one more than runnerup St. Louis. Suburban River Rouge and Utica followed.

John Palmer made St. Louis a rough customer as he won the 100-yard low hurdles in the record time of 20 seconds flat, nipping a tenth off the record he set last year. He also was second in the broad jump, third in the shot put and fifth in the high hurdles. Utica's medley relay's time of 2:31.9 set another record.

Class C produced three record breakers as Lansing Everett had no trouble overpowering the field. Everett's Scan Look topped the old pole vault mark by better than a half foot with a 12.6 hoist. The school's medley relay's time of 3:35.3 also was a record.

### High Jump Mark

Another mark went to Casey Clark of Berrien Springs who high jumped six feet, 3/4 inch, a 1/4 over the old mark.

Atis Grinsberg, Schoolcraft's all-around star, leaped 21 feet, 1 3/4 inches for a Class D broad jump record, while Bob Booker of Baldwin ran the 440-yard dash in 51.7, for another "D" standard.

The hard luck prep was Pete Dant, Alpena high's greater sprinter. He stepped the 100-yard dash in 9.7 and the "220" in 21.6 — a tenth under both marks which first were set in 1925. But a stiff breeze cost him a chance to land in the record book in either case.

## Cranbrook Loses

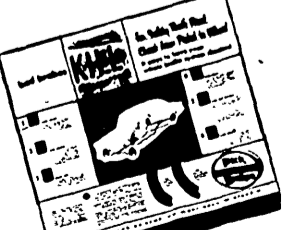
Assumption downed Cranbrook's baseball team, 4-1, at the Windsor college Saturday. Carl St. Pierre was winning pitcher.
