

# Jones Brilliant As Pontiac Wins Title

Ann Arbor—Pontiac High, a good team with a brilliant spearhead in Hayes Jones, walked off with the State Class A track championship here Saturday, scoring 61 points compared to 26 for runnerup Flint Northern High.

It was a similar race in Class C where Dean Look, a triple-threater in all sports, paced Lansing Everett to 45 points, 22 more than its nearest rival, Reed City.

Jones, who was too small to make Pontiac's regular unit as a sophomore, now is being hailed as another Harrison Dillard. His record 14.4 seconds time in the high hurdles, 19.4 in the low sticks and 23 feet 3/4 inches in the broad jump are especially impressive when you consider Jones is only 17 years old.

Jones also has high jumped 6-2 (good enough for second place Saturday) but he didn't even enter the event. In the broad jump he leaped 23-7, 23% and 23 1/2 in his other attempts, all four being well over the 20-year record of 22-11 1/2 set by Lansing's Ted Tycoock in 1936.

Jones ran 14.2 in the high-hurdle preliminaries but it didn't count as a record because of too much wind. Considering the State-wide praise of his hurdling ability, the low hurdle record of 19.1 established in 1953 by Flint Northern's Leon Burton rates even more prestige.

Lansing Everett's Look accomplished the one goal he had missed in high school sports when he cleared 12-6 for a Class

C pole vault record. A two-time All-Stater in football and basketball and an all-conference standout in all sports, Look hadn't earned an individual State championship before Saturday. He also ran second in the 100-yard dash and was leading the low hurdles before crashing into the final hurdle.

Dale Kellar, Flint Atherton's all-around sports ace, had similar misfortune when he suffered a knee injury after hitting the next to last high hurdle. He was in first place at the time.

While Look, Kellar and Alpena's Pete Dant (wind nullified his record 9.7 and 21.6 sprint times) had misfortune, Northern came up with its two best performances of the year.

John Sharp, a Viking half-back, churned to 50 seconds flat to lead the pack of 440 runners. The medley relay team of Francis Pierce, Arden Relford, John Dennis and Phil Gaines covered three-quarters of a mile in 2:30.9.

The only other Flint area firsts were by Bob Waters of Montrose, and Jim Collins of Northern. Waters won his 440 heat in Class C in 53 seconds flat, while Collins shared first place with six others at 11-6 in the pole vault.

Gerald Ketchmark's 10-10 pole vault for Swartz Creek for a fourth-place tie, and Kellar's Dye's sixth in the medley relay completed the area point-getters in Class C.

Flint Central's Capus Robinson ran fifth in the low hurdles and sixth in the highs for his team's only points.

Northern's other points came on Jim Moore's fifth in the high hurdles, Leon McGee's third in the lows, and the 880-yard relay's third by Dennis, Gaines, Price and Sharp.

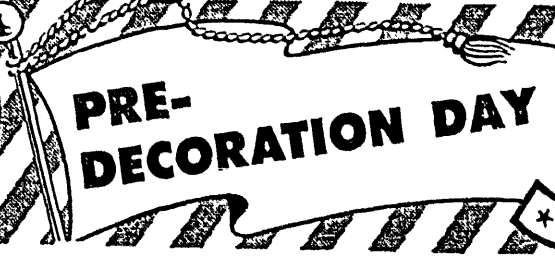
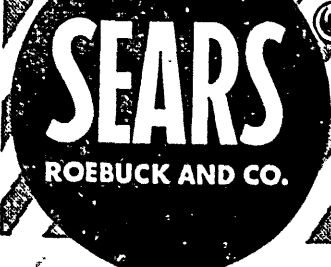
