

Sexton Finishes Fourth; Pontiac Wins A in Breeze

Look, Viking Medley Relay Team Set New State Records

ANN ARBOR, May 19—Lansing Everett left little in doubt here Saturday about who has the best Class C track team in the state of Michigan.

Paced by a versatile pair of athletes, Roger Quinn and Dean Look and with the team scoring in nine of the 13 events, Coach Archie Row's Vikings walked away from the rest of the field to win its second state championship in three years.

Everett finished with 46 points and left Reed City, packed by many as a presumed favorite to retain its title, far behind in the wake of some outstanding performances.

The contest begins every two consecutive years in the state meet held annually for the past 40 years. Pled up to its record-breaking forecast in its Class A honors, The Chiefs closed with 41 points. First Northern won a highly contested fight for second place with 26.

SEXTON FINISHES FOURTH
Birmingham was third with 23 and Coach Chastry's Foresters' Sexton crew was next with 20 points. Eastern did not break in to the scoring column.

Quinn and Look won enough points between them to give the Vikings the championship, but the pair had shared of help from their teammates, including a record-breaking effort by the Viking's spent medley relay quartet.

Having one of his best days in track, Quinn, a 6-4 bonnie who marks scored 18 points in three individual events and set a new mark of the winning 880-yard relay.

relay team. He won the broad jump with a leap of 25 feet 1 1/2 inches. He was second in both hurdle races, running behind Lincoln City's Don Miller both times.

VAULT RECORD
Look set a new state Class C record in the pole vault, finished second in the 100-yard dash, and won both hurdles in the second round. He finished with 14 in the division points, and also set a new mark of 12 feet 6 inches in the 800-yard relay.

Look vaulted 12 feet 6 inches to wipe out the former mark of the 11 feet 10 inches held by Everett's Dick Content. He missed being a double winner when he hit the final low hurdle in one of the best races of the day. Look was leading Miller and Quinn by a scant margin when he clipped over the final obstacle. He almost fell but regained his stride to finish in fourth.

Everett's quartet of Hallie Brink, Jerry Squires, Bill Moorehouse and Dick Gilmore scored the three-quarter mile spent medley in 2:25.3. The old mark of 2:25.5 was set by East Grand Rapids in 1952.

One other 'C' mark fell when Cawo Clark of Monroe Springs set a new mark of 1:12.5 in the 100-yard dash.

high jumped 6 feet $\frac{3}{4}$ inch to beat the old mark by a quarter of an inch.

Squires and Gilmore teamed with Quinn and Look to win the final half-mile relay. Bob Leslie was third in one of the 880-sections and Ron Hopkins was fifth in the mile for Everett's other points.

Sexton had one state champion crowned when Jim Nelligan won

one section of the 440-yard run. Sexton's 880-yard relay team finished second and its sprint medley was third. Tony Smith was sixth in the mile; Joe Thompson tied for third in the high jump; and Chuck Barnes was third in the 880 for the Big Reds' other points.

As expected, Pontiac's Hayes Jones and Alpena's Pete Dant were the meet stars. Hayes won three events, setting two state records.

Lansing's last "A" record was knocked off the books when Jones broad jumped 23 feet $8\frac{7}{8}$

inches. Ted Tycocoki, competing for Lansing Central in 1936, held the former mark at 22 feet $11\frac{3}{4}$ inches. Jones bettered his own high hurdle mark when he cleared the sticks in 14.4 seconds. Last year he won in :14.5. He won the low hurdles in 19.4 seconds.

Kalamazoo's Bob Lake bettered the half-mile record when he won in 1:58.9. The old mark, which was 16 years old, was 1:59.

Dant, Alpena's brilliant sprinter, suffered wind trouble twice, nullifying two possible record times. Dant ran the Class A 100-yard dash in :9.7, which would have been a record without the 5.1 m. p. h. wind at his back. A short while later, he ran the 220 in :21.6, better than the record, but nullified by a six m. p. h. wind. State rules do not allow any dash records run with winds of 4.474 m. p. h. or more.

Ken Blalock scored all seven of Holt's points with a third in the 220 and a fourth in the 100. Garth Richey of Okemos was sixth in the high hurdles and Jim Krieder won a section of the 440 for Okemos' six points.

Walt Estes of Williamston was sixth in the broad jump and Dick Osterle tied for third in the high jump.
