

MSD, Davison Area's Best

East Lansing — Michigan School for the Deaf tied for seventh in Class D and Davison placed eighth in Class B for the best Flint area performances in the State track meet here Saturday.

Fenton's Larry Taylor garnered the only first by a Flint area runner by winning one heat of the 880-yard run.

MSD's Ray Piper finished second in the the shotput, Mandeville's Dallas Griffin placed second in the 220 and Davison's Bob Adams was second in the high jump. Otherwise points were scored on third, fourth, fifth and sixth-place finishes.

The Class B crown went to Inkster for the third straight year in a photo finish with St. Louis, 33-32. The Detroit area team set a record in the final event — the 880-yard relay — to keep its title.

Covert bested Brethren in a close race, 28 1/2-25, for the Class D title, with the championship also coming via a first in the 880 relay. Brethren held the title since 1952.

Three other records were set. One which fell was the 440-yard dash of MSD's Bill Grisold set in 1940 Bob Booker of Baldwin ran the event in :51.7, clipping five-tenths of a second off the record.
