

St. Joseph Shades Set

Young Captures 3 Events

Jays' Ace Wins 100, 220, Broad Jump

Bishop Young, a 19-year-old sophomore, won three events and anchored the winning 880-yard relay team to lead St. Joseph High to its third Catholic League track and field title in four years at U. of D. Stadium Sunday.

The Blue Jays scored 46 points to edge Servite, the defending champion, and Orchard Lake St. Mary.

Mary is a bitter three-gam scrawler. Servite finished second with 29 points and St. Mary third with 25.

YOUNG WON the 100 (19.2), 220 (22.8) and broad jump (25-11) and anchored his relay team to a record 1:24.7 performance.

Three other records went to the boards. Paul Wyatt established an 880-yard mark of 2:14 for Servite; Bill Dropp of St. Bernard won the short put with a record throw of 117 feet, 8 1/2 inches; and Dan Kropp, St. Michael's St. Joseph, set a record of 3 feet 10 1/2 inches.

Servite was seriously handicapped in its attempt to win second straight title when John Marino, its star sprinter, underwent an emergency spinal operation.

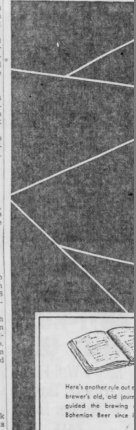
