A perfect season had ended today for Inkster High School's track team.

Already the winners of the state Class B championships, plus the Central Michigan and Albion College Invitationals, Inkster wrote a final brilliant chapter last night by taking top honors in the first annual "champion of champions" meet at Kalamazoo.

The Kalamazoo extravaganza truly befitted its name. Virtually all of the state's top prep thin-clads, regardless of their schools' class, battled against one another.

When it was over, Inkster reigned as unofficial team champion.

HAD THREE WINNERS

Inkster produced winners in three races. Charles Kyser took the 220-yard dash. Bill Wyatt finished first in the 440 and Kyser and Wyatt teamed with Charles Callaway and Charley Boyd to win the half-mile relay.

Kyser also took a fourth in the 100 which Joe Christie of Muskegan Heights won since Pete Dant, Alpena's state champ, was absent. He's in the midst of school examinations.

Walter Ector of River Rouge finished in a four-way tie for first in the high jump while Harold Didier of Birmingham placed second in the half mile.

CHIEFS MISSED IT

The only disappointing features to the crowd of 2,500 were the absence of Dant and members of Pontiac High's state Class A champs. The Chiefs passed up the meet claiming their season had already ended.
