Flint, Inkster Win Relay Titles in Mud

MT. PLEASANT, Mich., April 27.—Flint Northern and Inkster sped to victory in their respective classes in the 17th renewal of the Central Michigan College Prep Relays here today.

Flint unseated Pontiac as king of the Class A schools while Inkster successfully defended the Class B title it has won the past two years.

Northern relled up 551/2 points to second-place Pontiac's 40. It was Flint's first Central Michigan crown since 1950.

Inkster had a tougher time in beating off the challenge of River Rouge, 58-51. Detroit area teams claimed the first five places in Class B. Behind Inkster and Rouge came Ecorse. Redford Union and Willow Run.

RECORDS SPARED

Steady rains turned the unusually well conditioned Central Michigan track into a quagmire and consequently spared two individual meet records that were expected to fall today.

Willie Prewitt, of Willow Run, failed in his bid to top the broad jump record. He leaped 21 feet 32 inch, shy of the record by 654 inches.

"Another record under threat, the high jump, will exist for another year because rain forced officials to move the event indoors. Hudson Ray, of Pontiac, topped the record with a leap of 6 feet 5% inches, but it was disallowed as a new meet record.
