

Area Tracksters Falter But Lowell Star Wins

(By Associated Press.)

The favorites were admiring familiar first-place trophies again Monday after the fiftieth annual running of the state high school track and field championships at East Lansing and Ann Arbor Saturday.

Long established track powers took the team titles again with a single exception.

Pontiac High jumped into a commanding lead with a 1-2-3 finish in the high jump to win its third straight class A title with 33 points.

Bob Carlog, top Lowell distance runner, won the state class B mile with a 4:37.3 performance. Lowell finished in tenth spot in the final standings with nine points. Other area B results had Kelloggsville making five points for twenty-second place and East had four tallies for twenty-eighth.

Grand Rapids teams didn't fare too well in state class A competition. South tied Monroe for twenty-fourth place with three tallies while Catholic Central placed two notches lower with 2 6/11 points.

Mabin Places.

Barry Mabin, South's top 880 performer, placed second in the third section of the half-mile. Catholic's Tom Cunningham m placed sixth in the 120-yard high hurdles and Larry Wood of Catholic was in an 11-way tie for third place in the high jump.

St. Joseph, which has been winning class B honors as far back as 1927, took its fifth title in the 50-year history of the meet by dethroning defending champion Inkster. St. Joseph accumulated 32½ points.

Boyne City, winning its first class C title with an eight-man team, was the only newcomer in the parade of champions.

Covert High won its second straight championship in class D.

The meet was an oddity in that there was not a single record broken or tied in the A-C competition at East Lansing or the B-D meet at Ann Arbor.

Flint Northern, also the runner-up last year, was hurt by a disqualification after a first-place finish in the medley relay. The Vikings registered 26 6/11 points.

Charon Paces Boyne City.

Carl Charon of Boyne City contributed 13 points to the class C winner with a first in the broad jump, a third in the 100 and a fourth in the 220.
