# Area Tracksters Falter But Lowell Star Wins

Monday after the fiftieth annual running of the state high school track and field championships at East Lansing and Ann Arbor Saturday.

Long established track powers took the team titles again with a single exception.

Pontiac High jumped into a com-manding lead with a 1-2-3 finish in the high jump to win its third straight class A title with 33 points.

Bob Carigon, top Lowell distance runner, won the state class B mile with a 4:37.3 performance. Lowell finished in tenth spot in the final standings with nine points. Other area B results had Kelloggsville making five points for twen-ty-second place and East had four tallies for twenty-eighth.

Grand Rapids teams didn't fare too well in state class A competi-tion. South tied Monroe for twenty-fourth place with three tallies while Catholic Central placed two notches lower with 2 6/11 points.

performer, placed second in the third section of the half-mile. Catholic's Tom Cunningham placed sixth in the 120-yard high hurdles and Larry Wood of Catholic was in an 11-way tie for third place in the high jump.
St. Joseph, which has been winning class B honors as far back as 1927, took its fifth title in the 50-year history of the meet by dethroning defending champion Ink-ster. St. Joseph accumulated 32½

points. Boyne City, winning its first class C title with an eight-man team, was the only newcomer in the parade of champions.
