Soo, Munising, Pickford Take Cinder Titles

Houghton —AP— Sault Ste. Marie, Munising and Pickford scored one-sided victories in the Upper Peninsula State high school track meets for class B, C, and D-E.

The Soo, defending champion in Class B, scored 41½ points to 25 for runner-up Calumet. Munising dethroned four-time winner Houghton in Class C with 48½ points. St. Ignace was second with 34. And Pickford made it six successive titles in Class D-E with 54 points to 35 for second place DeTour.

High scorer for the day was Ken Harwood of Rapid River in Class D-E. He won the 100-yard dash, the 220, tied for first in the high jump and tied for fourth in the pole vault for 15½ points.

The other big individual scorer was Bob Perry of Iron River in Class B who won the broad jump and 120 high hurdles and finished second in the low hurdles for 14 points.

Only one record was set during the day. Pickford lowered its own Class D-E mark in the three-quarter mile medley relay from 2:47.5 to 2:47.3. The old mark was set in 1952.

The Soo won four firsts in Class B. Calumet, Ishpeming and Iron River took two apiece. The only double winner besides Perry in Class B was Bob Willis of Ishpeming who took the 100-yard dash and the 180-yard low hurdles.

This was the fourth time in the last six years that the Soo has won the title.

In Class C, Munising and St. Ignace both won four first places but there were no individual double winners.

Pickford took four first places outright and tied for another in overpowering the 17 Class D-E entries.

St. Joseph, Covert Track Champs

Ann Arbor — Six Flint-area schools scored points here Saturday in the Michigan Class B-D track meet but none came close to the team championships as St. Joseph copped the Class B title and Covert the Class D State trophy.

St. Joseph broke the three-year hold by Inkster on the B crown. The two teams battled evenly all afternoon and were tied at 27-all after the final running event of the day. But St. Joseph's points in the high jump meant the difference.

Two outstanding performers paced both 1957 champions to their titles. Jason Harness amassed 16½ points for St. Joseph and Covert's Quincy Johnson was the meet's leading point-getter with 18½ markers. It was Harness' first-place tie in the high jump at 5-feet-9 which brought victory. The All-State football end also was third in the broad jump and low hurdles and fourth in the high hurdles.

Johnson copped the Class D 220-yard dash and broad jump to spark his team's narrow victory over Dansville (39-34), the club which won the Dort Field Regional title in Flint a week ago.

Saturday's State track crown was the fifth for the St. Joseph crew. They won the first in 1927, then repeated in 1932, 1939 and 1945. Covert was the defending champion in Class D.

Grand Blanc in Class B and Goodrich in Class D made the best Flint-area showings. The Bobcats placed in three events, while Goodrich piled up 13 points for a seventh-place showing.

The Sefa brothers, Joe and Dan, were responsible for all but 2½ of Goodrich's points. Joe placed fourth in the 100-yard dash and sixth in the 220. Dan copped a third in the 220. The Martians won their heat of the 880-yard relay and wound up second to Covert in the final tabulation. Jack VanTine and Ray Kingsbury started off the Goodrich 880 relay with Dan and Joe winding up.

The only other area Class D school to score was MSD as Bob Grumm gained a two-way

tie for third in the pole vault at 10 feet.

Dan Branda and Bob Suci garnered all the Grand Blanc points. The versatile Branda finished fifth in the low hurdles to Ionia's Don Masengale, who won with a 20.1 clocking which was just a tenth of the record.

Branda turned in an upset in the morning qualifying heats. Two of the State's top low hurdlers, Jim Kendrick of Albion and John Williams of Ecorse, placed third and fourth in the heat won the Grand Blanc ace.

Clutch Pitching Nets Phils Win

St. Louis —UP— Curt Simmons bore down in the clutches Saturday to notch his third victory of the season as the Philadelphia Phillies beat the St. Louis Cardinals, 7-5, and sent the Red Birds down to their 10th defeat in 14 home games.

Branda also was in a five-way tie for fifth in the high jump, along with Lapeer's Tom Wilson. Both went out at 5-feet-8. Suci took a fifth in the broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 9 inches. Willow Run's Willie Prewitt, the lad who broke Jesse Owens record in the Mansfield (Ohio) Relays last month, won the broad jump with 20 feet, 5½ inches.

Kearsley sophomore Bill Baldwin took a third in one heat of the 880-yard run, Bart Misylak of Bendle tied for third in the shot put and the Mt. Morris medley relay quartet copped a fifth place.

Besides Johnson of Covert, who was stricken with polio last fall and missed about six weeks of school, the only other double winner here Saturday was Orville Emerson of Dans-

Emerson won the high hurdles in 16.4 seconds and the lows in 21.9. He did the same thing in the Dort Regional a week ago, setting a record in the low sticks of 21.1 seconds. His efforts kept Dansville in the lead throughout the afternoon. But the club was blanked in the 880 relay, while Covert won the event to clinch its repeat performance.

Inkster was paced by its two speedsters, Charley Keyser and Bill Wyatt. Keyser won the 220 and was second to St. Joseph's Terrie Montie in a photo-finish of the century. Montie was second in the 220. Wyatt, the lad who finished ahead of Northern's John Sharp in the Mansfield Relays, won the fastest heat of the 440-yard dash in 51.7 seconds. Both Keyser and Wyatt ran on both relay teams.
