HOUGHTON—Pickford's Purple and White maintained its regional competitor, DeTour, to win the title with ease, scoring 54 points, while runner-up DeTour netted 25.

The repeating champions established the only second set at the U. P. Finals last Saturday as the Pickford medley relay team shaved two tenths of a second off the mark set by another Pickford team in 1952. The new time was 2:47.3. Pickford copped four first places and tied for another in retaining its title.

The individual star, however, was Rapid River's Kenneth Harwood, who copped two first place victories and tied for a third. He won the 100 and 220 yard dashes in addition to trying for first in the high jump.

Chassell's Don Mattson, veteran state basketball star, copped two first places in the shot put and broad jump.

In all Pickford copped four places, tied for another. Rapid River, won three first places, tied for two others. Chassell, three first places; DeTour, three and tying for another; and Doyle, tying for a first place.

Sault Wins U. P. Class B Track Crown, Ironwood Places 10th

HOUGHTON—The Sault Ste Marie Blue Devils, showing strength in eight events, retained their Upper Peninsula Class "B" track and field title at Houghton last Saturday. The Lake City sides squared amassed a total of 41 1/2 points to establish any new records during the meet primarily because of the chilling, easterly winds which swept into the evening dash distance, relay and hurdle runners.

In retaining its title, Sault won the "B" championship four out of the past six years, dominating the peninsula track sport for the most part.

Spectators Bob Wolf, of Isabella, and Bob Perry, Iron River, captured the 100 and 220 yard dashes in the outstanding time of 1:04 seconds and he landed Iron River's Perry his first defeat in the hurdle race this season. Will speed through the 180 yard low hurdles to top the Rodkin timber-toppe by a fair margin.

Perry, despite losing in the low hurdles, captured the 180 yard high hurdles and the broad jump event.

Champion Sault Ste Marie copped four first place wins with John Fletcher copping the 400 (first) section. Bill Cooper taking the high jump. Barry Armstrong, capturing the shot put and Sault's 800 yard relay team was a brilliant winner in that event.

Runner-up Calumet took two first places with Tom Westlake capturing the second section of the 400 yard run and Kenneth Pello racing across the finish line first in the second section of the 800 yard run.

Other winners included Rodney Paavola, Hancock pole vault; Tom Anderson, Negaunee, mile run; Jim Brancic, Escanaba, first section, 800 yard run; Mike Farley, Manistique, 220 yard dash and the Menominee Maroon 3/2 mile medley relay team.

Kingsford Regional "B" victory at Ironwood last week, placed seventh in the U. P. finals and Ironwood, runner-up to Kingsford, to establish any new records during that event.

Strohmose, which was conceded an inside chance of dethroning Sault, and retaining the title they won two years ago placed eighth in the final Class B standings. Marquette, the only squad to defeat the Sault powerhouse this year, when they copped the Great Lakes Conference title, was third.

Greater depth and strength in first and second places were the key factors in winning the title for the Blue Devils again this year.
