

# 3 Records Broken in Parochial Track

Parochial League track athletes are getting better and better and better in a sport which the league started only eight years ago.

League finals in four field events were held in the University of Detroit Stadium yesterday and records were set in three. More marks were in prospect in today's running events.

League records were broken in the shot put, broad jump and pole vault. Joe Waluk, of Orchard Lake St. Mary's, shoved the 12-pound shot 48 feet 7 1/2 inches, erasing the heave of 47-6 1/4 made last year by Bill Kropp, of St. Bernard's.

Ralph Ziomek, of St. Joseph's, leaped 20-9 in the broad jump, an improvement of three inches over the performance of Marvin Raab, of St. Bernard's, five years ago.

Three boys, Chet Wajda and Pete Madelans, both of Orchard Lake St. Mary's, and Mike Pyne, of Servite, finished in a three-way tie in the pole vault at 11-6, half a foot higher than Tom Kalasz, of Orchard Lake St. Mary's, made in 1954.

"The competition is certainly getting keener every year," observed Vernon Foley, Servite coach. "I was sure my boy would win the pole vault if he did 11 feet. Yet three boys were able to go 11-6."

Danny Dropps, of Pontiac St. Michael's and Larry Vargo, of Servite, tied for first in the high jump at 5-8.

Orchard Lake St. Mary's made a surprising showing with 19 1/2 points, more than double the total of favored St. Joseph's, the defending champion. St. Joseph's went into today's closing events with 9 1/2 points; Servite has 8 1/2, DeLaSalle 8 and St. Michael's 7 1/2.
