

# Muskegon Trackmen Show Well at 'Champions' Meet

Kalamazoo, May 31 — Although Greater Muskegon athletes failed to win any first places all acquitted themselves well in the second annual Champion of Champions track meet here last night.

Tom O'Neil of the Heights was second in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, finishing less than a yard behind Bob Jones of Battle Creek in each event. Jones was clocked at 10 seconds in the 100 and at 22.1 seconds in the furlong.

Jerry Fitzpatrick of Muskegon Catholic Central took second in the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet, 11¾ inches. The event was won by Joel Johnson of Kalamazoo Central who went 22 feet, 7 inches. Fitzpatrick also picked up a third in the 100-yard dash behind Jones and O'Neil.

Dick Cahill of Muskegon and Harry Allore of Catholic tied for third in the pole vault at 11 feet, 9 inches. The event was won by Comstock Park's Rodney Denhart with a vault of 11 feet, 11½ inches. Bill McFarland of Birmingham was second.

Jones was voted the outstanding athlete in the meet which was run under perfect weather conditions.

Chicago, May 31 — (AP) — The executive committee of the National Collegiate Athletic Assn. yesterday approved the dates and sites of five national collegiate championship events. They are:

The 1958 cross country, Michigan State University, Lansing, Nov. 25

The 1958 ice hockey, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, March 13-15.

The 1958 swimming, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, March 27-29.

The 1958 wrestling, University of Wyoming, March 28-29.

The 1958 boxing, at Sacramento, Calif., under joint sponsorship of University of California at Davis and Sacramento State College, March 27-29.

The committee received a report from the NCAA Olympic committee showing that colleges and universities have contributed \$547,588 to the continuous fund raising campaign for the Olympics.
