

Ballman Ties Kramer's Track Mark

Gary Ballman gave one of his best track performances yesterday as East Detroit trounced Hazel Park, 74-35. The 6-foot-1, 195-pound senior tied Ron Kramer's low hurdles mark of 20 seconds flat set five years ago.

Ballman also won the high hurdles in 15.2, heaved the shot put 49 feet 9½ and anchored the half-mile relay victory. He piled up 16¼ points of a possible 20.

Frank Santangelo, Thurston freshman, repeated a three-hitter in subduing Oak Park, 6-3. He struck out seven, collected two hits and drove in three runs. Last week he lost a three-hitter to Cody on four unearned runs.

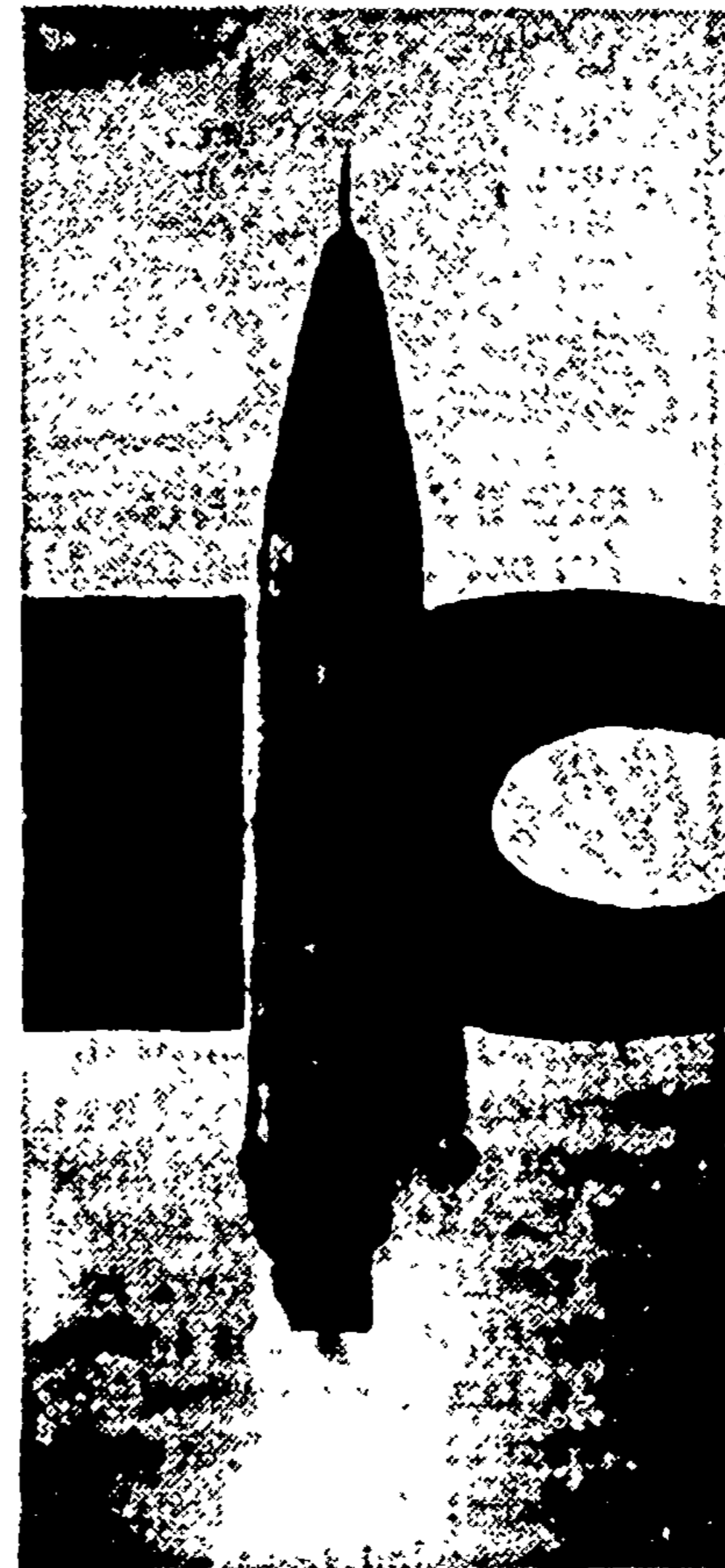
five-hit pitching of Marv Fodor. Bill Hyde rapped out four hits.
