

**IN CHIP RELAYS**

**Norman-Dickson, Rouge Win Titles**

MT. PLEASANT—River Rouge, in Class B, and Norman-Dickson High, of Brethren, in Class D, successfully defended team championships here Friday in the 18th annual Central Michigan Relays.

Ten records went by the boards on a gusty and chilly day. All except pole vaulter Larry Horgan, of Big Rapids, beat the late afternoon showers.

Horgan set one of the ten records when he finally hoisted to both height and the elements at 12 feet 3½ inches.

**RIVER ROUGE'S** 23-member squad won four first places outright and tied for a fifth in claiming its third relays' crown in four years with 47 points.

Willow Run, like Rouge, a member of the Twin Valley Conference, finished second with 8½ points.

Following Willow Run came Cass City 23, Marysville 21, Crambrook 20, Mt. Pleasant 20 and Lake Orion 19.

For Norman-Dickson, a small school in Northwestern Manistee County, it was its eighth championship in nine years here. Brethren accounted for three records and seven first places with its top-heavy 64 point total.

**SPRING ARBOR** was second with 39. Beal City third with 31 and Pickford, of the Upper Peninsula, fourth with 23½.

**Saturday, Class A and C teams in the record field of 2,700 individuals from 173 schools will take over the Chippewa oval starting at 9:30 a.m.**

Hurdlers Don Gardner and J. E. Broadnax brought Rouge victories in the high and low hurdles, respectively, and also performed on the victorious shuttle hurdle relay team. Broadnax set a record of :19.6 in the lows.

**COACH ROY** Krueger also watched his Panthers win the middle-distance relay and tie Ludington in the sprint medley relay. The Panthers finished second behind Willow Run in the 880-yard relay.

A Willow Run quartet of Nay Pole, Mel Austin, Otis Harrison and Willie Prewitt won both the 880 and 440-yard relays. Prewitt also set a record of 21-feet 10 inches in the broad jump and finished in a four-way tie for third place in the high jump.

**MSU Pins First Loss On Indiana**

**EAST LANSING**—Foot-ball halfback Dean Look blasted a towering 415-foot home run and added a pair of singles Friday as Michigan State walloped Indiana, 10 to 3, for the Hoosiers' first Big Ten defeat.

Michigan State scored four times in the first inning after the Hoosiers had taken a 1-0 lead, and the Spartans never were headed as southpaw Ron Ferranowski scattered nine hits.

The victory set State's record at 2-2 in conference play while Indiana is 3-1. Bill Smith took the loss for Indiana.
