Voorheis posted :09.8 in the 100-yard dash and broke a 25year-old record of :10.0 set in 1933 by Hamilton White of Boyne City. Voorheis also won the 220-yard dash in 21 seconds flat.

Peltz scored a triple. He won the 120-yard high hurdles in :15 0, spanned 21 feet 3 5/8 in the broad jump, and posted :19.6 in the 80-yard low hurdles.

Brethren successfully fended its state high school Class D track championship by outdistancing runnerup Beale City, 37 1/8 to 30 2/3, in what was strictly a two-team battle. Galien was third with 162/3 points, and Grass Lake and Spring Arbor tied for fourth with 15 points.
