Edges St. Joe in Class B; Pontiac Class A Victor

Boyer City and Brethren Cop C and D Divisions

East Lansing—(UPI)—East Grand Rapids took only two individual titles but edged out River Rouge for the state class B high school track championship Saturday.

Rollin Douma won the low hurdles in 19.3 for East Grand Rapids, a full-seven-tenths of a second better than the existing record. But the mark won't be recognized because of a six-mile-an-hour trailing wind.

Douma also won the high hurdles event. East Grand Rapids picked up points in the 100 and 220-yard dashes, the high jump and the medley and 880-yard relay events.

St. Joe Ousted.

East Grand Rapids had 30½ points to 29 for River Rouge. Willow Run was third with 21½ points.

Defending champion St. Joseph failed to land a place among the first 10 finishers.

Willie Prewitt of Willow Run and Larry Horgan of Big Rapids shattered records while Prewitt lost a second record because of the wind.

Prewitt won the broad pump with a record leap of 23 feet, 2¾ inches. Horgan made a record 12-foot, 5¼-inch jump in the pole vault.

The 880-yard relay was the last and deciding event. East Grand Rapids held a slim edge of only three-eighths of a point over River Rouge going into the 880 but took the relay and the title.

The old standbys—Boyer City, Brethren and Pontiac—continue to dominate Michigan's high school track championships in their fields.

Only East Grand Rapids was able to provide a new touch to the same old story Saturday.

It was Pontiac for the fourth straight year in class A, Boyer City for the second year in class C and Brethren again in class D.

Six marks were broken or equalled in the class D meet. Champion Brethren accounted for half as it piled up 37½ points to Runnerup Beale City's 30½. Ken Beane was class D's only double winner, capturing the 100-yard and 220-yard runs for Brethren.

Boyer City Edge Close.

Boyer City edged Grosse Ile 23-21 in class C. The champion's Steve Williams high-jumped 6 feet 1½ inches and set a new record for class C. But it was Grosse Ile's Chuck Peltz who turned in the meet's outstanding performance. He was a triple-winner, notching the 120-yard high hurdles, broad jump and 180-yard low hurdles.

Don Voorheis of Frankenthum was another brilliant class C performer as he traveled 220 yards in 21 seconds flat. His time was remarkable, especially when compared with the :21.3 that Bobby Mitchell of Illinois turned in while winning the Big Ten 220 title Saturday.

Barto Is Winner.

Jerry Barto, Grand Rapids Catholic Central shotputter, won the shotput in class A tossing the 12-pound ball 54 feet, 7½ inches. His teammate, Steve Sichterman, was third behind Wally Herrala of Muskegon Heights.

Grand Rapids Central's 1-2 combination of Jim Keegstra and Doug Eggleston shared a

five-way tie for sixth place in the pole vault.

Wyoming Park's Roger Seth shared a four-way tie for second in the pole vault and Coopersville's Ken Simpson won third in the shotput.
